

Town of Sawmills
Minutes of Meeting
June 26, 1990

The regular meeting of the Town of Sawmills was held at town hall at 5:00 PM on June 26, 1990.

All the members of the board were present: They were, Bill Ramsey, Max Andrews, Maxine Stamey, CJ Baker, Paul Pope and Eddie Wilson.

Mayor Bill Ramsey called the meeting to order. CJ Baker gave the invocation. The minutes of the regular meeting held on June 12, 1990 were approved as presented.

The hiring of Randy Laws was tabled until the next meeting.

The petition for the closing of Church Street, running west from Benfield Drive to Adams Drive was also tabled until the next meeting.

Maxine Stamey made the motion that the Water Extension Policy be tabled until next meeting. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.

Eddie Wilson made the motion to accept the amended budget for the year ending June 30, 1990. Max Andrews seconded this motion. All were in favor.

It was decided to call for a special meeting on the Code Book at the next meeting.

Paul Pope made the motion, seconded by Maxine Stamey for a 25 mph speed limit sign to be placed on the Greenwood Terrace street, beginning at 321A Highway, running the length of Greenwood Terrace street. All were in favor.

Maxine Stamey made the motion that Terry Taylor, town lawyer, write a letter to the State Board of Elections stating that Sawmills would be willing to reconsider its request and resolution whereby the Town opted to conduct its own municipal election if the State Board of Elections would direct Caldwell County Board of Elections to establish one municipal voting place within the Town limits for the conduct of all future municipal elections. Motion was seconded by CJ Baker with all in favor.

Mayor Bill Ramsey opened the second public hearing on the Subdivision Ordinance and the Zoning Ordinance. Dee Blackwell with Western Piedmont Council of Government was again present. As there was no comment, public hearing was then closed.

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CJ Baker made the motion to adopt the resolution on the Zoning and the Subdivision Ordinance to be effective as of midnight, June 30, 1990. Paul Pope seconded with all in favor.

At 6:32, Maxine Stamey made the motion to adjourn. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.
