Minutes of Meeting
July 10, 1990

Mayor Bill Ramsey called the meeting to order with all members present, they were, Bill Ramsey, Max Andrews, Maxine Stamey, CJ Baker, Paul Pope and Eddie Wilson.

Invocation was given by Eddie Wilson. The minutes of the last meeting and the treasurers report were approved.

Maxine Stamey made the motion to hire Randy Laws full time. Motion was seconded by Paul Pope. All were in favor.

The street closing was again tabled.

Paul Pope made the motion to adopt the Informal Bid Procedures, Formal Bid Procedures, Accident Report, Travel Training Expense Request, and the Travel Expense Report as prepared by the towns lawyer, Terry Taylor. Seconding this motion was Max Andrews with all in favor.

A report was given by Chester West, Engineer, on the Water Study.

After some discussion with Clarence Clontz's lawyer, Don Robbins, about the Holly Springs subdivision, Paul Pope made the motion not to accept cluster meters in the subdivision. CJ Baker seconded. All were in favor. Motion was made by CJ Baker that the board be presented with a primary plat with individual meters on each lot before coming to a decision. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.

Eddie Wilson made the motion to have a special meeting on Monday, July 23, 1990 to review the Code of Ordinances manual. Max Andrews, seconded. All were in favor.

Motion was made by Eddie Wilson to accept a contract with Western Piedmont Council of Governments to hire Don Albert as Planner for the Town of Sawmills. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.

Eddie Wilson made a motion to adopt the Water Extension Policy prepared by Terry Taylor, and to adjust the tap fee rates from \$300.00 to \$400.00 in the event that the person or persons extending a line shall have a right to recover part of their money for taps other than those serving his property made to line(s) for five years from the date of installation of the line(s). Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.

Maxine Stamey made a motion to adjourn at 7:05 PM. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.
