

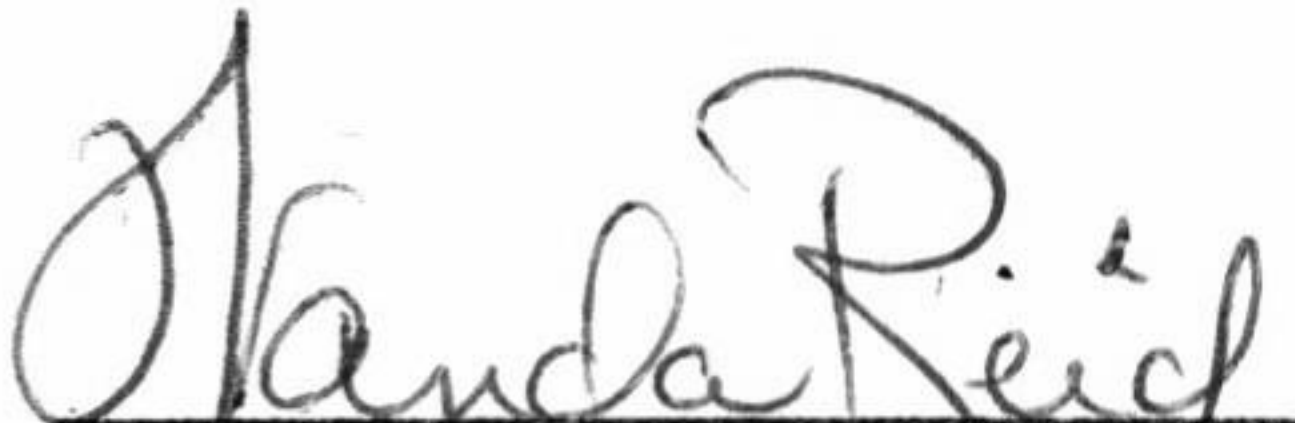
TOWN OF SAWMILLS SPECIAL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 27, 1993-7:30 PM

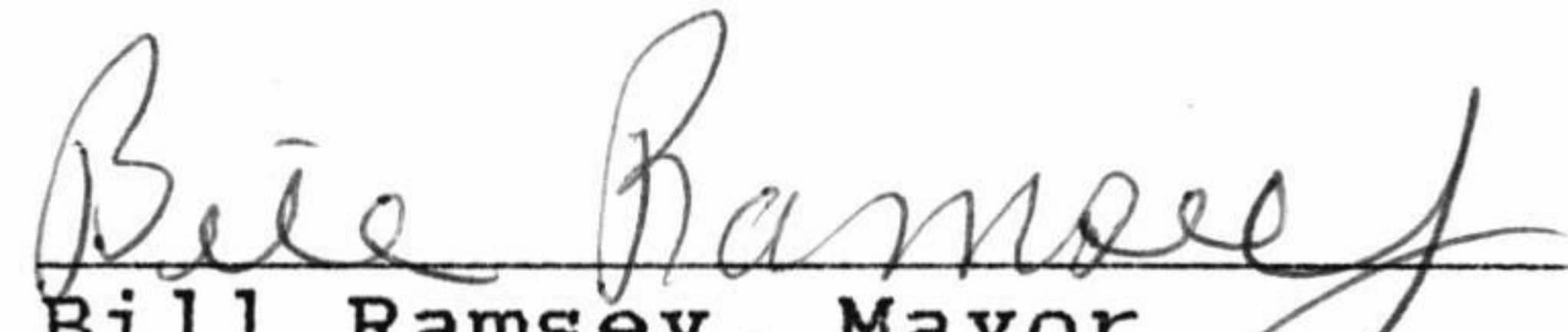
Mayor Pro-tem Max Andrews called the special meeting to order with Bill Ramsey absent. Max Andrews, Paul Pope, Dennis Wilson, Larry Prestwood, and Tim Sanders were present.

Invocation was given by Dennis Wilson.

Ms. Rebecca Veazey, representative with the Management and Personnel Services, from Cary North Carolina, reported to council of the extensive classification and pay study she had conducted with the Town's employees in August 1993. This evaluation will establish a classification and pay plan for the Town of Sawmills's employees as well as making recommendations concerning personnel policies and fringe benefits. After a lengthy discussion it was decided to call a special meeting on October 25, 1993 and invite the candidates running for mayor and council to attend this meeting.

At 8:35 a motion was made by Dennis Wilson, seconded by Tim Sanders to adjourn. Vote unanimous.

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TOWN OF SAWMILLS MINUTES OF MEETING
OCTOBER 5, 1993-7:00 PM

All members were present as Mayor Bill Ramsey called the regular meeting to order. They were; Bill Ramsey, Max Andrews, Paul Pope, Dennis Wilson, Larry Prestwood and Tim Sanders.

Invocation was given by Rev. Fred Hicks.

h., Harold Bean, i., Annas Drive, j., Stamey Road, were added to the agenda. Tim Sanders moved, Larry Prestwood seconded to adopt agenda with changes. Vote unanimous.

On a motion made by Tim Sanders, seconded by Max Andrews, Council moved to approve the minutes of the special meeting held on September 27, and the regular meeting of September 21, 1993.

Paul Pope made a motion to pay all bills. Larry Prestwood seconded. All were in favor.

On a motion made by Dennis Wilson, seconded by Max Andrews, council moved to adopt an ORDINANCE REGULATING SMOKING IN MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS AND VEHICLES, effective this 5th day of October, 1993, (see attached). All were in favor.

Ruth Campbell, and Joyce Dozier, representatives of the Lenoir News Topic appeared before council requesting that council take an add in the Lenoir News Topic during the weekend of October 30, 1993 at a cost of \$448.50. Dennis Wilson moved to not take an add out this year, with Larry Prestwood seconding. Paul Pope, Tim Sanders, and Max Andrews opposed. Motion failed. In another motion, Max Andrews moved, Paul Pope seconded, to purchase one half the add requested. Max Andrews, Paul Pope, Dennis Wilson, and Tim Sanders voted for and Larry Prestwood opposed. Motion carried.

On a motion made by Larry Prestwood, seconded by Paul Pope, council moved that Randy Laws and Wanda Reid be designated as Purchase Agents for the town.

Ronnie Annas, resident of May Road, requested from council a two inch water meter on his property because he stated that he could not get pressure so he would go with flow. Approximately eight citizens of May Road related that they had good pressure and Mr. Annas did not have a need for a two inch meter. This would take from their water pressure. On a motion made by Dennis Wilson, seconded by Larry Prestwood, council moved that Mr. Annas get a 3/4 inch water meter and to get the pressure checked on May Road.

Larry Prestwood moved, Paul Pope seconded that Dennis Wilson be in charge of the town's Christmas Parade and Christmas Dinner this year. Vote unanimous.

On a motion made by Tim Sanders, seconded by Larry Prestwood, council moved to move Annas Drive up to now on the agenda. Vote unanimous. Residents attending the meeting were instructed to get two petitions (100%) signed. One petition for surveying, and one in order for the town to take over Annas Drive as a town street.

Larry Prestwood made a motion to adopt a RESOLUTION REQUESTING RELEASE OF STATE FUNDS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (see attached), as requested by Western Piedmont Council of Governments. Paul Pope seconded. All were in favor.

Larry Prestwood moved, Dennis Wilson seconded, that Assistant Finance Officer, Randy Laws be allowed to attend a two day workshop in Boone, November 4th and 5th, 1993. All were in favor.

On a motion made by Larry Prestwood, seconded by Paul Pope, council moved that the town's attorney, Terry Taylor, do what was needed to begin eviction of the Bowen trailer, located on property the town purchased from I A Crunkleton in April 1993. This land is needed for parking space and housing of the garbage trucks.

After the town's office averaged a water bill for resident Harold Bean, (\$211.61) from a broken water line, Larry Prestwood moved, Dennis Wilson seconded that Mr. Bean be allowed to have until the next billing to pay this bill. All were in favor.

Tim Sanders made a motion to place 25mph speed signs for trucks on the Stamey Road. Larry Prestwood seconded. All were in favor. After some discussion, Mr Sanders withdrew the previous motion.

Paul Pope moved, Max Andrews seconded to adopt the Caldwell County 1994 HIGHWAY PRIORITIES RESOLUTION as requested by the Highway and Transportation Task Force. Max Andrews, Paul Pope, Dennis Wilson, and Larry Prestwood approved. Tim Sanders opposed. (See attached).

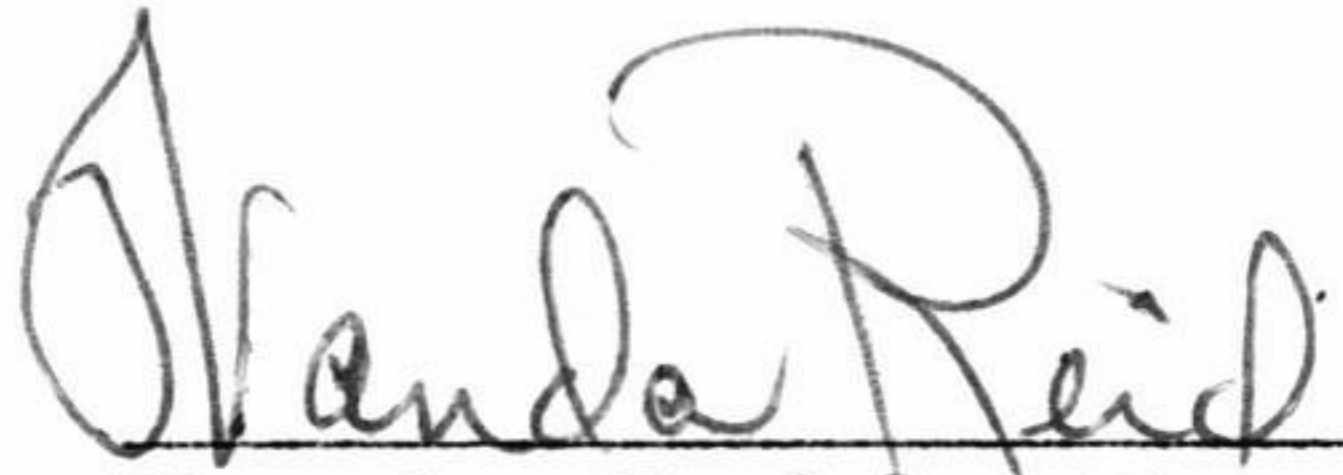
On a motion made by Max Andrews, seconded by Paul Pope, council moved to let the two CD's in Centura Bank renew themselves. One CD for \$222,593.00 and the other for \$111,296.00. All were in favor.

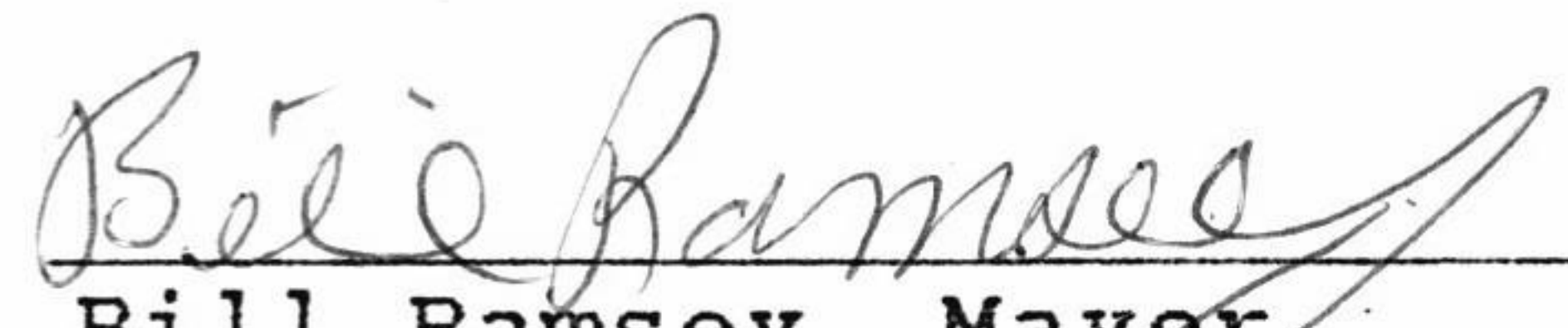
